Spotlight on Research

The SLP's Role in Reading & Writing

SLPs can help identify and assess children who are at risk for reading, writing, and spelling problems. In particular, children who had significant speech sound errors when they were very young may still have underlying problems that resurface when they are learning to read. Children who had delays in learning to talk may also have difficulty learning to read because reading is a language-based skill.

SLPs can provide therapy that addresses phonological awareness, spelling, reading fluency and comprehension, and written language.
